Commodore.

The following points from the published Commodore Report were discussed:

- The Commodore thanked all members for their valuable contribution to the AWYC over the year.
- In particular, she noted that the Training Centre helped to significantly raise the profile of the Club and was also a major contributor to funding the new Pizza Oven area.
- The Commodore thanked those involved in our Sail Country event, which last year was highly successful, both in terms of revenue and participation. Sail Country is highly regarded by other sailing clubs as a sailing event.
- The Commodore also thanked members for their contributions to the Safety Boat Fund. This fund will be reviewed again after the revenue from Sail Country comes in this year.

Annual Subscriptions for 2018-2019

Membership rates will rise by CPI in the following year, meaning that fees did not rise for the 2017 – 2018 year.

It was the view of the Treasurer that core membership costs should be borne by membership subscriptions, and reliance should not need to be placed on the individual business units, the galley or events such as regattas. For this year, there was a deficit as fuel, water, lease costs and other Club costs exceeded the funds raised by subscriptions.

The Treasurer thus raised the issue as to whether the AWYC should register for GST, and recommended that it not register for GST until revenue exceeds the statutory amount of \$140K.

General Business

Minor Changes to Model Rules:

Recitals: There is a “typo” in the Recitals of the Model Rules that needs to be corrected. The words refer to “ . . . *am* incorporated association” that should read “ . . . *an* incorporated association”.

Rule 50: The Model Rules refer to the “first annual general meeting . . .” which is no longer relevant.

Proposed wording for 50(1):

This rule applies to any general meeting of the Association, after the Annual Report and financial statements of the Association have been received.

Rule 55: The reference in the Model Rules to the “Term of Office” for Flag Bearers requires Flag Bearers to have held office for 9 months prior to nomination. The AWYC proposes to change this rule to refer to the Commodore only. This is to encourage more members to participate on the Committee and volunteer for short term projects and events.

Proposed wording for 55(3):

The Commodore must have previously been a flag officer or member of the General Committee for a period or periods in aggregate of not less than nine (9) months

The proposed changes do not materially effect the administration of the Club or the operation of the Model Rules.

Commodore's Report

Leanne Thomson - Commodore

This season was my second full year as Commodore and my last (as per the Club Rules). It has been a busy and I feel successful season, starting with a Season Launch that saw the official opening of the new Pizza Oven / BBQ area. This new area has been a great Club asset and well utilised through the season.

We also started the season with a new POS operating system for the café. This system has been easy to use, making member duty in the café easier and capturing sales information. It allows us to set up multiple terminals, which proved very useful for Sail Country.

Sail Country was again one of the major highlights for the Club. For the 5th year in a row, again incorporating the Victorian Dinghy Championships, AWYC hosted the event. The Victorian Laser Association also incorporated the 2018 State Masters championship in our 2017 regatta. The event was capped at 200 entries competing over 4 courses. It makes me proud to see our members contributing to the success of this event, which has become a well know regatta that the sailing community talk about fondly. I encourage everyone to consider volunteering for this year's Sail Country on the 4th & 5th of November. (Register your availability at www.trybooking.com/370131)

During the season the Victorian Officiating Committee conducted a Race Rules Information Night at AWYC. This was followed by a Club Race Officer's seminar the following. The Club and its members should take advantage of these opportunities made available by Australian Sailing, especially when they are happy to travel to us!

This season saw 35 members competing in Club racing (not all regularly). The winner of the Commodore's Trophy was ARTwork (Tasar) – Daryl Stone, Vice Commodore's Trophy was Yeah Baby (29er) – Oscar Henderson, Rear Commodore's Trophy was Chomp (Laser 4.7) – Riordan McMillan. Whilst racing sailors was down slightly (a reduction by 3 compared to the prior season), social /recreational sailing was still high, but not in a structured manner. More group social sailing opportunities may be something to look in to further in the future. I know mid-week twilight sailing is a growing activity in the city.

Congratulations to Laura Thomson who has been inducted in to the Victorian Institute of Sport (VIS) for Sailing. Laura qualified after a successful Nationals and Worlds campaign in the 420 class with Sophie Jackson. Laura has now moved across to the 49erFX (Women's Olympic Skiff) with Laura Harding from Blairgowrie Yacht Club and the girls have been progressing well.

As we move in to our 60th year it is time to reflect on the past and look towards the future. Sadly, we lost one of our Founding Life Members - Bruce Avery during the season. Bruce served as a committee member and Commodore for several years. He was made a Life member in 1982.

Thanks must go to Herman Van Ree and Peter Quigley, who through the season have put together plans to submit for tender for the Club House re-development. Prices have come in for the initial plans and discussions with the membership group will decide how to move forward on this project.

We have finished the year off with the purchase of our new safety RIB, which is another asset building our Club and ensuring the safety of our members. I thank the members and the wider community for their generous donations towards this project. A special thanks must go to the Commercial Club Albury, who through the Club's NSW program have contributed towards the purchase of the motor for the RIB.

I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank the Management Committee for their support over the last season. Over the past almost 3 years whilst I was in the role of Commodore the support of the Committee and the AWYC membership has been appreciated. Being our Club's first female Commodore I was unsure how well I would be accepted when I started the role. I encourage the membership to support our next Commodore and consider how they can help make our Club a better place.

Vice Commodore's Report

Terry Kerr – Vice Commodore

I can again assure the Club that all aspects of the Club's administration are, where practicable, up to date and well on the way to complying with current legislation. During the year there has been more updating of our policies and procedures and some documents have been consolidated to improve readability. The bulk of effort however, has been positioning our Club to comply with the Working With Children legislation, more on this below.

Below is a short report on the three main areas of responsibility and attached at Annex A is the current state of the objectives within the Business Plan.

Business Plan

As was anticipated last year the Clubhouse Rejuvenation Project drew attention from the Business Plan. That said though, the Business Plan continued to progress with further objectives being completed and the majority of the Work in Progress items progressing.

Although the Clubhouse Project will presumably continue to distract from the Business Plan, there is no foreseeable reason why the Business Plan shouldn't continue to progress.

Policies, Procedures and Plans

After the significant changes to the Club's documents last year, this year has been refreshingly quiet. The Health and Safety Manual has been completed and will be available to members on the Club's website shortly. The only notable, outstanding issue is with the Working With Children Checks.

It was determined that the only practical means for the Club to comply with the Working With Children legislation was for all members to hold a Working With Children Check (card). Although there has been a significant uptake there remains a number of members who are yet to provide a Working With Children Check document.

Strategic Planning Committee

Following last year's AGM a number of members expressed interest in being part of the Strategic Planning Committee (or Team as it has become known). The Team has met twice since then, the first meeting resulted in a broad understanding of the nature of the Team and what it aims to achieve. This enabled a charter to be developed which was subsequently ratified by the Committee of Management.

As it is envisaged that the Team will have a role, perhaps quite significant, in the Clubhouse project meetings have been on hold pending progress with the Clubhouse.

Looking past the above, there are no foreseeable administrative aspects of our Club that would be of concern to members. Indeed, there is every reason for members to believe that administratively, our Club is in a very sound position.

Victorian Institute of Sport

Congratulations to Laura Thomson on qualifying for the Victorian Institute of Sport (VIS).

Laura is sailing the Olympic Women's Skiff - 49FX and is working hard on her strength and endurance in the VIS facilities at Albert Park Lake in Melbourne, whilst sailing out of Royal Brighton Yacht Club.

Along with her skipper (Laura Harding) they are training for the regatta lead up to their National Titles in January, before hopefully heading overseas in 2019. With the 2019 Worlds in Auckland (in Nov) and the 2020 Worlds in Melbourne (in Feb) the girls are excited for what lays ahead.

**This was after the removal of deceased Life Member Bruce Avery.*

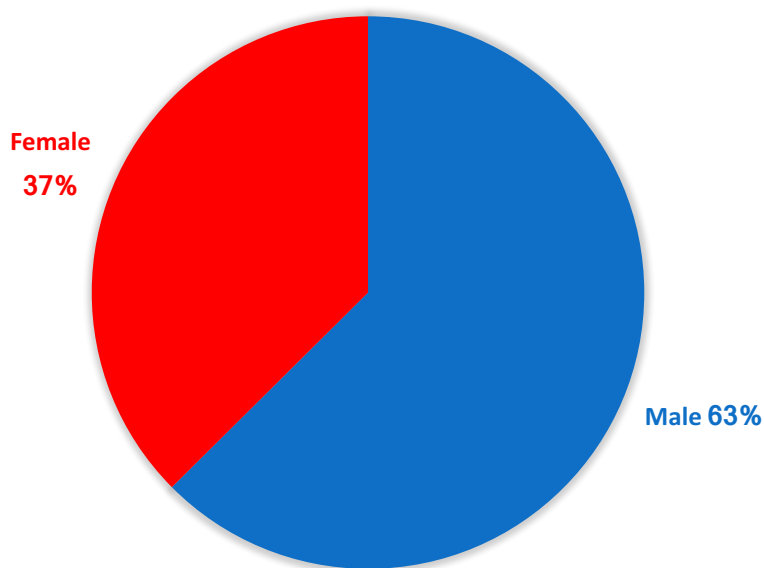

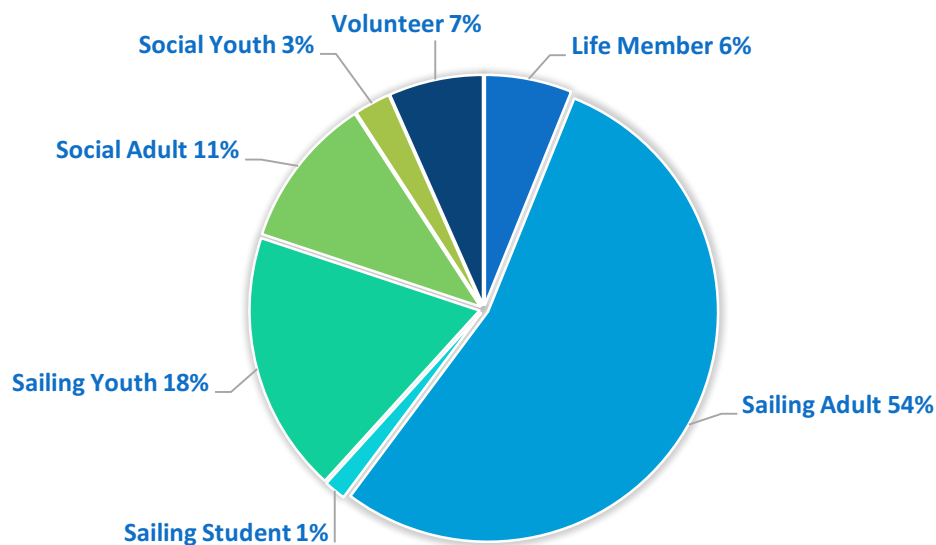

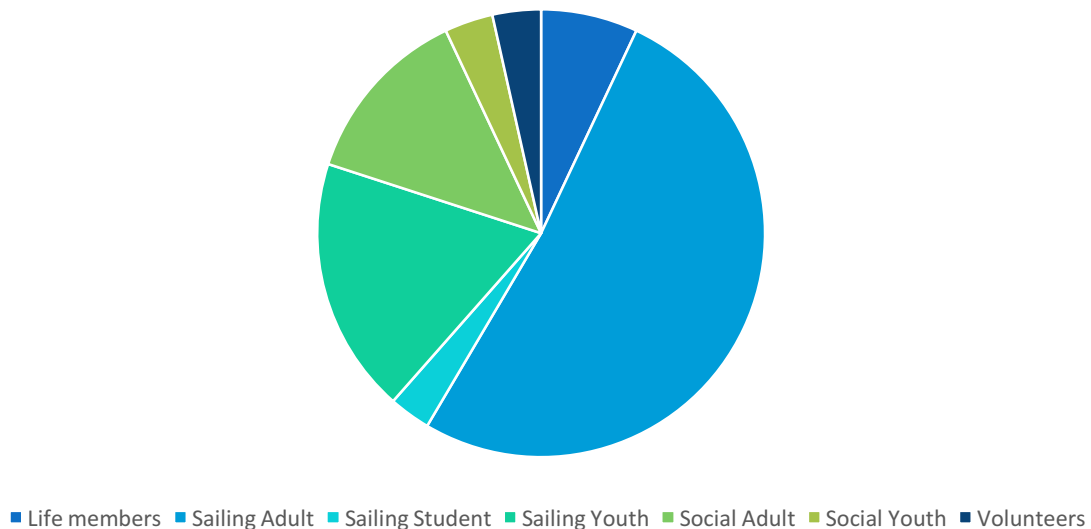
MEMBER GENDER SPLIT

New Online Platform

Next season will see a move to a new online platform with a new provider; RevSPORT. This has been a lot of work for our Commodore, Vice-Commodore and external IT service providers, working in collaboration with Australian Sailing. There were many issues to be resolved and co-ordinated, with the transfer of data, maintaining data integrity and a new online payments platform, but at last we are able to move forward.

As is often the case, our current provider SportsTG was becoming less relevant for our needs and for the sailing community in general as it focused more on the larger sports communities of AFL and the NFL.

Victoria has seen a 49% growth across all the Discover Sailing Centres so providing a solid platform for growth was important. RevSPORT has worked hard with Australian Sailing and Yachting Victoria, on the changeover to ensure the new platform meets the needs of both small and larger clubs.

Secretary's Report cont.....

Some of the benefits are:

- Better user experience with user friendly interface giving a better experience for club administrators and end users, including generating reports and searching capabilities. This means that the Club can promote events nationally, find officials to assist with events, verify participants sailing qualifications. The public can locate clubs in their area and training courses and access and change their membership details;
- Single member record as supposed to Sports TG with MyCentre and MyClub;
- The capability to integrate with external systems. This is important as Australian Sailing plans to facilitate the integration of common membership systems with revSPORT to allow automatic membership detail updates, which will reduce duplications. Further revSPORT will now be able to integrate commonly used competition management systems to allow memberships to be verified and results processed more easily.



The move to RevSPORT has also allowed us to have a website that points through a virtual server that points to their server. The website address is now www.awyc.org.au. It has a much better look and feel, particularly on mobile devices. The new website makes the Club easier to locate on the various search engines, such as Google, and this enhances our accessibility and reach into the community.

David McGeachin Memorial Award Club Person of the Year 2018



This year's Club Person of the year was Mark Harris. Mark spent last winter working on the Pizza oven project. Along with his band of helpers they created a fantastic asset for the AWYC membership. The Pizza Oven was officially opened at our Season Launch and well utilised throughout the season.

One of its first major tests was Sail Country, at which Mark cooked pizzas on the Friday evening, as well as providing on-water support on race days. Mark also cooked pizzas during other functions and social events.

Mark also continued working on the Sailability Jetty, refining its features to ensure both participant and volunteer safety and comfort. A regular at Sailability sessions he assisted the team in providing over 200 sailing experiences last season.

As well as working on large projects for the Club, Mark is always ready to jump in and help with smaller jobs. You will often see him on the tractor grading the ramp surrounds, repairing broken equipment and in the lead up to Sail Country preparing the grounds for the visitors. Mark also purchased a new gate and installed it the day after it was damaged, securing the Club and member's assets.

Treasurer's Report – 1st July 2017 – 30 June 2018

Jeff Stirling – Treasurer

Introduction

Please note that the accompanying financial reports for the year ended 30 June 2018 include the results of Sailability Albury Wodonga (Sailability) together with the results of the club at large.

Results

The overall net surplus recorded for the year ended 30 June 2018 was \$41,175 (2017: \$70,921) Included in that result were donations received with thanks from:

- The Rotary Club of Albury West : \$9,528 – Sailability Jetty (2017 : \$9,500)
- Commercial Club of Albury : \$500 – Sailability donation (2017: \$500)
- Club members : \$2,347 - Safety Boat (2017: \$5,962)

Sponsorship income was received in relation to our “Sail Country” Regatta, and various other assistance was provided from other supporters for that event.

Membership subscription and storage fee income was slightly lower than in the prior year.

In addition to core membership activities, the club had four main income producing activities for the year, the results of which are included in the overall surplus of \$41,175.

The net contribution to the 2018 surplus from each of those activities was:

The deficit in “other membership activities” includes all club expenses not directly attributable to one of the four income producing activities mentioned above, and includes general grounds maintenance and improvements on which in the 2018 year we spent \$16,193 (\$4,400 on tree lopping, \$6,700 on levelling and grading the West boat park, \$1,100 on electrical improvements and the balance on various improvement projects.)

Treasurer's Report cont.....

The Club's Financial Position at 30 June 2018 – Balance Sheet

Net assets at 30 June 2018 were \$520,846 (2017: \$479,671) as listed on the balance sheet.

Cash at Bank \$69,465 (2017: \$57,674) and on Term Deposit \$41,714, (2017: \$40,920) were held at year-end to fund club operations for the next year and to hold in reserve for future improvements to club facilities.

Funds were invested in various capital equipment and infrastructure projects to the extent of \$25,354, (2017: \$47,931) – Listed under Purchased Additions 2017/2018; and in addition to that a further \$6,021 was invested in the completion of the outdoor kitchen.

The club had no debt at 30 June apart from normal trade creditors of \$2,946, (2017: \$3,626) which have been paid since the end of the financial year, and Income in Advance of \$3,500 being sponsorship for Sail Country 2018 received in June 2018.

Registration for GST and Membership Fees

The club was required to register for GST from 1st July 2018.

Accordingly, all Club income from 1 July is deemed to include 10% GST and the Club is able to claim back from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) 10% GST on expenditure incurred from GST registered businesses.

The ability to recoup GST on costs incurred means that it has not been necessary to increase membership fees and charges by the full 10% GST impost.

Fees for the 2018/2019 financial year have been increased by around 5%; representing a part contribution to the cost of GST that the club must pay to the ATO, and the usual inflationary increase.

The club should still be able to operate with a reduced surplus for the 2018/2019 year on that basis.

Future Financial Goals / Clubhouse Project

The Committee has commenced preliminary discussion with representatives of Wodonga City Council with a view to exploring the possibility of the Council sponsoring our application for State or Federal grant funding.

The next step would appear to be a process of exploring how such a project might be funded, what implications there might be for the look and feel of the club, and whether the members wish to undertake the project.

The Committee will report separately on those matters and seek engagement from all members. The outcome of those investigations will very much influence the future financial plans of the club.

30 June 2018

Note 1: Summary of significant accounting policies

In the opinion of the Committee, Albury Wodonga Yacht Club Inc. is not a reporting entity because there are no user's dependant on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the committee's accountability requirements to prepare and distribute financial statements to the members and must not be used for any other purpose. The Committee has determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards with the exception of the following:

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis of accounting including the historical cost convention and the going concern assumption.

(a) Income Tax

No income tax is provided for in the financial statements on the basis that the association is a non-profit organisation and therefore exempt from income tax pursuant to the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(b) Property, plant and equipment

Each item of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost. No depreciation is applied to items of property, plant and equipment.

Maintenance and repair costs are charged as expenses as they are incurred.

(d) Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when received with the exception of grant revenue which is recognised in line with the expenditure of the related funds. Unexpended grant balances received are recognised as liability.

Note 2: Events after the Balance Sheet Date

There were no significant events occurring after the reporting date likely to impact the affairs of Albury Wodonga Yacht Club Inc. in the future.

Discover Sailing Centre Report

Donald Thomson – Training Principal / Australian Sailing Coach / AS Dinghy Instructor ~ Racing

Whilst my name is listed as the Training Principal, I had little to do with its operations this year. As stressed in prior years, my commitment to the Discover Sailing Centre (DSC) was a 3 year plan and I had not been replaced in the position after 6 years. Succession planning is critical for the Centre's survival. The new online RevSports system should make administrations tasks for DSC's a lot easier moving forward.

I would like to thank my wife Leanne, who conducted the operations of our Discover Sailing Centre this past year. An amazing effort on top of her Commodore commitments (and a full time job).

At 294, numbers of students through the Centre for the 12 month period was very solid. The financial results of the Centre are visible in the prior pages of this booklet. Whilst income was less than the prior year, it was above that of the 2016 year (the year prior to last).

The Dinghy Program was popular this year, with a fully booked Start Sailing 1&2 package prior to Christmas and 8 students continuing through to the February Better Sailing Course. Total dinghy numbers were slightly down on the previous season, but it is very rewarding to see the retention rate higher, with much larger student numbers in Better Sailing.

Leanne worked hard with the Tackers Team this year, mentoring some of the older youth to Instructor level. (Several have just completed their AS Dinghy Instructor Qualification). This should help moving forward as it will remove the reliance on Leanne being in /over-seeing so many classes. We also have a large group of Assistant Tackers instructors coming through the ranks, with some very keen Trainees following close behind.

Local schools again showed a growing interest in sailing programs. Sporting Schools Tackers courses (Government subsidized) were again popular in term 4, along with other Primary Schools completing Tackers Introductions. Secondary schools again saw Victory Lutheran College complete a Start Sailing 1 class and Wodonga Senior Secondary College attended a Sailing Introduction. A big thanks to the mid-week volunteers who make these opportunities available. Special thanks to Terry Caldwell who over-saw these courses from the shore during his shoulder recovery.



Erwin & Alex Bejsta again provided powerboat Instructing to our Discover Sailing Centre. This year saw a growth in Powerboat Handling students on the prior year. The 16 students included non-members which was great to see.

Thanks to Terry & Helen Kerr (MYNYX) our Discover Sailing Centre again provided First Aid Training. 6 students completed first aid courses, gaining valuable life skills that could save a life.

At the end of the season our Pacers were looking a little tired. I wish to thank Terry Kerr and Stuart Howsam for taking on the task over winter to complete some much needed maintenance. This task was bigger than they expected and they have learnt a lot during their progress. New members Thurston and Suzanne Kent volunteered to varnish the Tackers centreboards and rudders and I wish to thank them for this job.

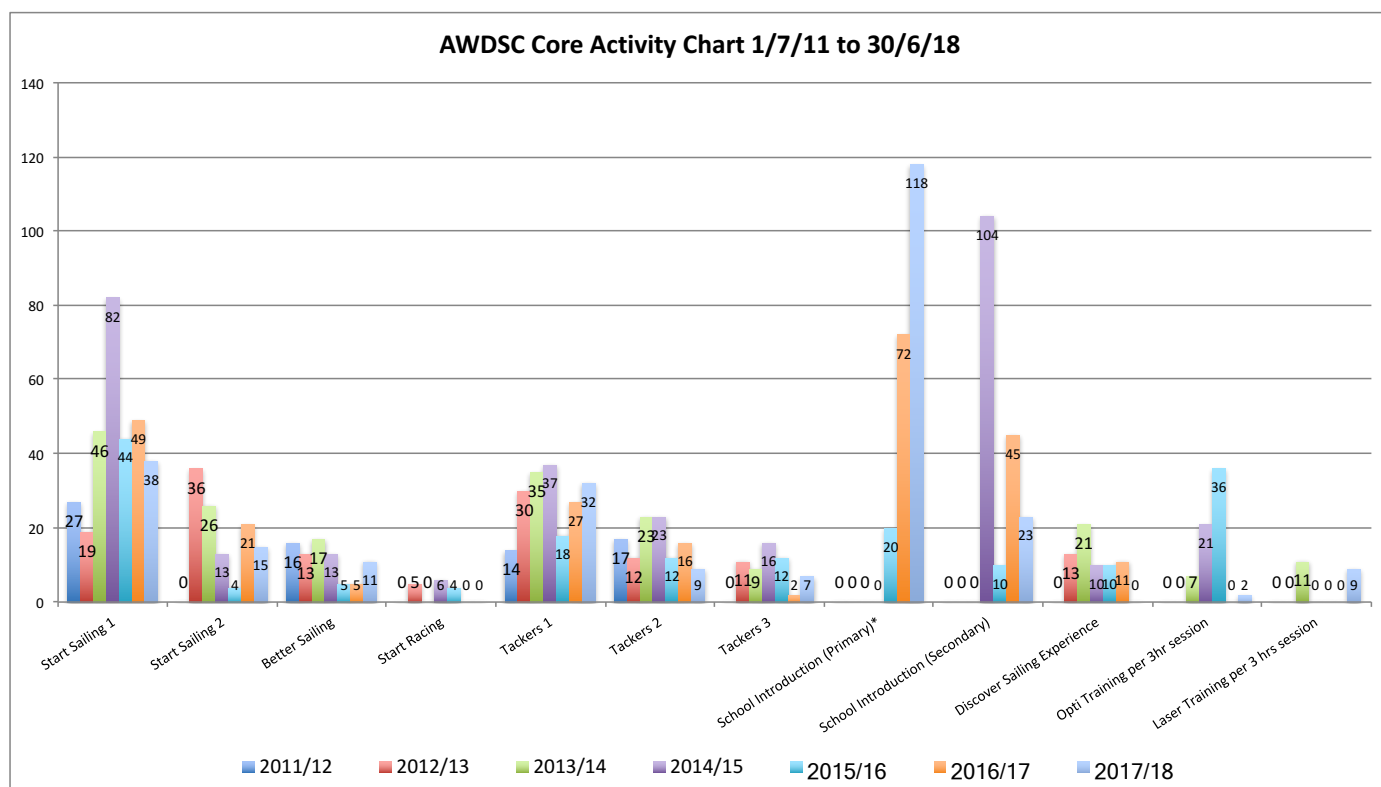

The Sailability program for this last season was very well supported by both participants and volunteers. We would like to especially recognise and acknowledge the fantastic group of around 30 volunteers from the club and two from outside the club, who have given their time to enable this terrific program to take place. This has included some weekdays and Saturdays as well. Thanks very much, your efforts have been well appreciated by the participants, the carers and the club.

During the season we provided over 200 sailing experiences for nearly 140 individuals. This represented a 35% increase in participation compared to the previous season. The Saturday session attendances ranged from a low of 11 to an all-time record of 41 at the January session.

Our sailing crews have come as either individuals or from organisations such as Vision Australia, Life Without Barriers, Mercy Connect, Home Rehab Services, Murray Valley Centre, Aspire and Kalianna.

Without exception, the feedback has been incredibly positive. It has also been a very rewarding program for the volunteers who have enjoyed the interaction with people who may not be as mobile as us but are still able to experience the same 'joy of sailing' that we are all fortunate to experience.

We also hosted a 'Thankyou' day for one of our biggest supporters, the Albury West Rotary Club. This was held in conjunction with a Sat session and was well attended by the Rotarians and some of their partners and families.

I know I speak for all our volunteers when I say that the Sailability sessions are as enjoyable for us as they are for the participants and every session produces a heart-warming story or two that makes us pleased to be involved!

Having high water levels for the start of the season, together with near perfect weather for each of the sessions, enabled our guests to fully enjoy the club's grounds and by making good use of the main ramp we had relatively easy access to the water for most of the season.

The 'new' Sailability jetty that was re-constructed by Mark Harris and his trusty off-siders, Brian Radomski and Peter Nelson, with occasional extra support from various other club members underwent some further improvements. We were also fortunate to have engineering support from both **Bertazzo's** and **SJE Consulting**. This jetty has made for a much more serviceable and safer operating platform for both participants and volunteers. A huge thanks to the '3 Musketeers' especially but also to everyone else that has played a role in getting this challenging work completed.

Remember that Sailability is for EVERYONE so it can be a great way of introducing people of all ages and abilities to the sport of sailing.

A nucleus of five volunteers, Cathy Hawksworth, Helen Wilson, Cathy Howsam, Charlotte Todros and myself provided the Café Team supervisory role in the Café for season 2016-7. We were assisted by duty personnel when they were able to give some of their time. This enabled us to keep the café running and help provide the members with a service they appreciate. Thanks to all those who were able to help.

The club hosted various activities that helped provide an income for the club and promoted it as a good place to be.

The Triathlon Club held their aquathons during the season and really enjoyed the pizzas provided after their races. Thanks to Terry and Leigh Caldwell, Wes Ward, Jacob and Mary-Anne Scully for their assistance in preparing and cooking the pizzas. Compliments flowed as usual and the Tri club was most impressed with the new BBQ area.

Several functions were held over the Christmas period and early in 2018 and thanks to those who assisted with managing these functions:

- An Army social club held their Christmas function at the club and enjoyed the experience. Thanks Terry Caldwell for hosting this one in my absence.
- The Dip for Dempsey was again a success with better water conditions than last year. The bar was open for the occasion and did well.
- The Hartley Championships were also a success with the participants really enjoying the pizzas provided on that occasion too.
- A casserole night was held at the club with a small number of members attending and thoroughly enjoying the food and company.

The new ovens installed during the last season have proved an asset. They were particularly handy on the Tuesday of Sail Country, when the pie warmer had been returned and we needed to heat many pies and sausage rolls.

The income generated by the club is also vital to the development of the club into the future. From Oct 1 to April 31 cafe did 3444 transactions totalling \$31,181.00. However, without volunteers the café cannot be sustainable. It is untenable for the café to continue trading with only a few people working in the café over the season. Selecting a couple of weekends a season to volunteer your time in the café (as your membership duty) and putting your name down on Dutyman will be appreciated.

There are also opportunities to be part of the Café Team to provide the continuity and a supervisory role for the duty volunteers. The members of this team are required to complete a Food Management (online) course. Having a Victorian RSA is also an advantage. Both of these courses are subsidised by the club. The job entails helping the volunteers with preparing and serving food, making coffee (training provided) and acquitting the till at the end of trading on the Sunday. Mentoring is provided until you are confident with your role. The more people we have in this role the less duties are allocated to the individual.

As I won't be managing the Café this season, I would really like to thank everyone who contributed to running the Café. I appreciated all your efforts and look forward to working with you when doing my member duties.
