Ever Wonder?

Why isn't a Fireman called a Water-man? If money doesn't grow on trees, how come Banks have Branches? If a Vegetarian eats vegetables, what does a Humanitarian eat? How do you get off a non-stop Flight? How come Noses run and Feet smell? Why are goods sent by ship called CARGO and those sent by truck SHIPMENT?

Deck Shoes

Deck Shoes were first invented by Paul Sperry, a former member of the US Navy, in 1935. Sperry was intrigued by his Cocker Spaniel's ability to walk and run on ice without slipping. After examining his pet's paws Sperry replicated what he saw by cutting 'w' shaped patterns in the soles of his shoes with a knife. And thus the deck shoe was born.

The initial design was further improved over the next 4 years and a white sole, that didn't mark the deck, was introduced. These improvements made the shoes very popular with yachtsmen and in 1939 the US Navy adopted the shoe as official footwear. The popularity of deck shoes continued to grow into the 1970s and was further popularised by a number of cameo roles in Hollywood films.

With the introduction of a number of competitors into the market, deck shoes began a phase of rapid development with the introduction of modern, quality materials and improved construction. Thanks to the endorsement of US sailor Dennis Conner, Sperry's shoe became the official shoe of the America's Cup in 1987. Deck shoes continued to evolve through the '90s and into the new century where today they bear little resemblance to Paul Sperry's original design.


