Please Lock the Lock

Recently the lock on the Club's front gate failed due to moisture infiltrating the inner electronics. One simple means to prevent moisture infiltration is to ensure the lock is always locked. If the gate is to be left open for more than a few minutes, when driving through the gate for example, please ensure the lock is properly locked and not left hanging in the open position.

Fresnel Lens

The Egyptian Pharos are believed to have used beaten copper reflectors to increase the glow from their braziers. It wasn't until the 1820s though when the French physicist Augustin-Jean Fresnel installed his lens in Bordeaux, France that a cylindrical beam of light was produced.

Fresnel discovered that the efficiency of a lens depended more on the contours of the lens than the thickness of the glass from which the lens was made. By removing the excess glass Fresnel was able to increase light capture level of a lens by 70% while reducing its weight by a factor of ten.

He further developed his lens by producing a series of concentric prisms that captured and reflected the light outwards into a narrow horizontal beam. A further modification to Fresnel's lens produced an all-round horizontal beam, this eliminated the need for a rotating mechanism.

Fresnel's principles are still in use today although most lenses are made of plastic rather than glass.



Tractor Usage Notice

There was a recent incident where the tractor was found to have been effectively run dry of fuel. As this is potentially harmful to the engine, to ensure our tractor lasts as long as possible, please ensure the fuel tank does not drop below the one quarter mark. Refuelling, when required, is the responsibility of the driver not the Maintenance Coordinator. Please use the yellow jerry can; it only takes a few minutes.
